As we enter the final week of this school year, I want to thank Liz Squillace and the new Communications Committee for creating the framework of our new school newsletter, The Shamrock.

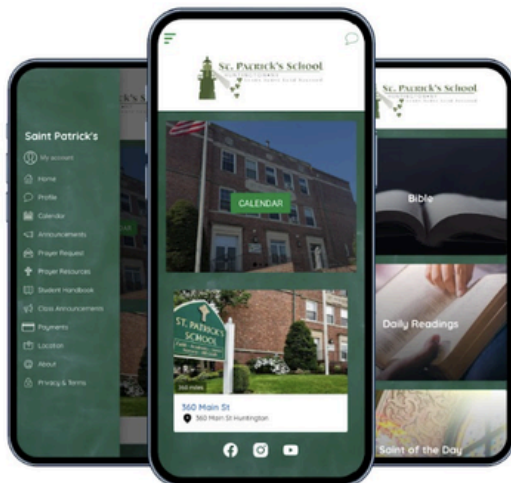

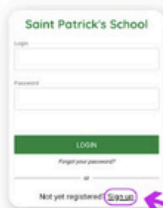
